Respect, empathy and compassion



Questionnaire Results

Carr Gomm is committed to providing the best support possible.

As part of checking that we are having a positive impact in people's lives, we use a bi-annual survey to gather feedback and to understand what improvements, if any, need to be made.

Here are the results of the August 2024 questionnaire.



Results and actions

questionnaires were returned. (A 29% return rate)

92% of people who responded said their service is working for them.

69% of people would recommend Carr Gomm to others.

Out of a maximum score of 6, all services received at least a 5 (of the services who received one or more responses).

I am involved in decisions about my support.

92%

The people who work with me understand my needs.

94%

Staff listen to me.

94%

My service is well organised and managed.

96%

My support is making a positive difference to my life.

93%

If I had a suggestion to help improve my service, staff would take me seriously.

94%

If I had a concern or complaint about my Carr Gomm service, staff would take me seriously.

What are the things you most like about your Carr Gomm service?

265 respondents shared a compliment about their service:

- "I like how it is tailored for me personally."
- "Nothing is too much trouble, and they are reliable. They arrive on time and get the job done."
- "Because of their help, I can go on living in my wee house, not have to go into a 'Home'."
- "Carr Gomm's service is reliable, always open for improvement, and has reasonable communication."

What improvements would you like to see in your Carr Gomm service?

122 people shared an improvement suggestion for their service:

- "Try to have regular carers to build trust and relationships."
- "Better communication. If there are any issues with my mother and I am not present I would like to know immediately."


The group worked together, cheering each other on to conquer the challenging obstacles, climb higher, and zip-line through the trees.

Our person-centred conversations identify what people living with complex support needs believe is most important about their home.


For some people, this may mean coming home to Argyll.
